

**Newlin Township
Board of Supervisors
Meeting Minutes
March 9, 2026**

Call to Order: The Board of Supervisors' monthly meeting convened at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, March 9, 2026 at the Township Garage located at 1751 Embreeville Road. Present were Supervisors Jim Cornell (Chair), Bob Pearson and Secretary/Treasurer Gail Abel. Bill Kelsall was unable to attend.

Announcements: Mr. Cornell announced that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") will host a public meeting on Thursday, April 2, 2026 6 to 7:30 p.m. to provide an update on EPA's upcoming remedial action to address contaminated drinking water resulting from discharges of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances ("PFAS") from the Strasburg Landfill superfund site.

Comments: Richard Mitchell inquired about permitting process for construction or renovation, and thanked the Supervisors for addressing some of the bamboo issues on Laurel Road. Mr. Pearson advised that more bamboo will be removed in the Summer months.

Minutes for Approval: Ms. Abel presented the minutes of the February 9, 2026 Board Meeting. The Supervisors tabled the vote due to Mr. Kelsall not having attended that meeting.

Financial Report: Ms. Abel presented the monthly Financial Report: As of February 28, 2026 the Township had \$695,948.23 on deposit, including \$409,358.99 in general and unrestricted funds. Overall, this represented a net increase of \$23,073.95 since January 31, 2026. Mr. Pearson's motion to accept the Financial Report was seconded by Mr. Cornell and unanimously approved.

Bill Payment Authorization: Ms. Abel presented a list of pending bills, invoices and other recurring/routine payments totaling \$29,317.91 from the General Fund Account and requested payment authorization. Mr. Pearson's motion to approve the requested payments was seconded by Mr. Cornell and unanimously approved.

RoadMaster Update: Mr. Pearson noted that there have been some falling rocks on Laurel Road which will be taken care of shortly. He also noted renewed complaints of speeding on Laurel Road. He advised that Laurel Road speed tabulations since February 23 had shown only two vehicles at speeds above the posted 25-mph speed limit. He indicated that the flashing speed sign (which tabulates traffic volume and speed) would soon be moved to another location.

Adjournment: Upon Mr. Pearson's motion, seconded by Mr. Cornell, the meeting was adjourned.
