COMMUNITY UPDATE

Update on Upcoming Remedial Action

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is providing an update on the Strasburg Landfill Superfund site and the upcoming Remedial Action to address contaminated drinking water. Groundwater contamination associated with the site impacted private drinking water wells. While EPA has taken steps to address exposures to contamination in the short term, EPA is moving forward with its long-term plan to permanently eliminate exposure to groundwater contamination for residents.

In spring 2027, EPA plans to start construction work at the site to install a new water main and residential water service lines as part of the Remedial Action. This project will provide a clean source of drinking water for impacted residents.

Construction Work

The community can expect to see surveying, utility work, and temporary fencing installation. Once construction begins, expect to see heavy equipment such as dump trucks, steel plates, small excavators, asphalt paving equipment, and tractor trailers delivering equipment and materials.

Work Schedule

The construction team's regular workdays will be limited to Monday through Friday. Site work will not be performed on Saturday and Sunday.

Construction Practices

Traffic control measures will be put in place during work hours. Residents can expect to see flaggers and signage reducing the roads to one lane at times.

Site Location and Background

The Strasburg Landfill Superfund site is located in Newlin and West Bradford Townships in Chester County, Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) discovered landfill leachate PFAS contamination during a routine quarterly sampling event. Subsequent sampling confirmed the presence of PFAS in groundwater monitoring wells and residential drinking water wells.

Addressing Contaminated Drinking Water

EPA and PADEP are currently providing filter pitchers and bottled water to affected homes near the site. EPA continues to sample and monitor affected homes to ensure protectiveness. In the spring of 2026, EPA will provide carbon-filtration systems to affected homes. These systems will be routinely monitored and maintained by EPA until construction of the permanent waterline is completed for the Newlin and West Bradford Townships community.
